



**An introductory *circle of trust* retreat for Clergy and Congregational Leaders
based on the work of Parker J. Palmer**

October 27-29, 2009 • Glenview United Methodist Church, Glenview, IL

Over the past decade under the guidance of Parker J. Palmer, highly skilled facilitators across the country have created a unique retreat-based approach to renewing personal identity, professional integrity, and vocational vitality. This approach is now being offered to a growing number of interested clergy and congregational leaders through an initiative funded in part by the Lilly Endowment.

We invite you to participate in an introductory Courage to Lead retreat for leaders from diverse religious communities. We will begin the retreat at 3 pm on October 27 and end at 3 pm on October 29. This retreat program is part of Courage & Renewal for Congregational Leaders, a multi-year, national initiative to help congregational leaders renew and sustain their own spiritual resources and to contribute to the vitality of congregational life.

In *A Hidden Wholeness: The Journey Toward an Undivided Life*, Palmer describes the importance of creating “circles of trust,” trustworthy spaces in which honest sharing and deep learning can occur:

In this culture, we know how to create spaces that invite the intellect to show up, to argue its case, to make its point. We know how to create spaces that invite the emotions to show up, to express anger or joy. We know how to create spaces that invite the will to show up, to consolidate effort and energy around a common task. And we surely know how to create spaces that invite the ego to show up, preening itself and claiming its turf! But we seem to know very little about creating spaces that invite the soul to show up, the core of ourselves, our selfhood.

In this introductory Courage to Lead retreat, a cohort of 24 clergy and congregational leaders will gather in large-group, small-group and solitary settings, to share our inner journeys via personal story-telling, poetry and teaching tales from various wisdom traditions. Guided by skilled facilitators, participants will be invited to speak honestly about their lives and work and to listen and respond to each other—and to themselves—with encouragement and compassion.

In addition to this introductory retreat, a series of four seasonal Courage to Lead retreats for clergy and congregational leaders will also be offered at the retreat location in Mundelein, Illinois. The series is intended to build up on insights and discoveries participants experienced either at an Introductory Retreat or initial Seasonal Retreat series. This additional time and support will enable clergy to fully reflect on new discoveries, consider their ramifications and integrate this new awareness more fully into his/her life. RETREAT FACILITATORS

The Rev. Barbara Hummel works with leaders and organizations from corporations as well as public and non-profit sectors to help them be more authentic and effective. She has also facilitated teacher, clergy, and cross-professional circles of trust over the past eight years. She has a master's in counseling, and brings the experience of being a "PK" to her strong interest and commitment to spirituality. Barbara is an active member of Orchard Ridge United Church of Christ in Madison, Wisconsin.

LOCATION AND COST

The retreat will be held at the Glenview United Methodist Church in Glenview, IL. Because there is not on-site lodging, this retreat can accommodate commuters as well as those choosing a local hotel of their choice.
